

Founder and Chairman of Boies, Schiller & Flexner LLP, David Boies was named Lawyer of the Year by the *National Law Journal*, runner-up Person of the Year by *TIME Magazine*, Antitrust Lawyer of the Year by the New York Bar Association and Commercial Litigator of the Year by Who's Who in America. Boies served as lead counsel for former Vice President Al Gore during litigation of the 2000 Presidential election, and he served as Special Trial Counsel for the United States Department of Justice in its successful antitrust suit against Microsoft. Mr. Boies served as counsel to the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation in its litigation to recover losses for failed savings and loan associations, as Chief Counsel and Staff Director of the United States Senate Antitrust Subcommittee, and as Chief Counsel and Staff Director of the United States Senate Judiciary Committee.

Bryan Burrough joined *Vanity Fair* in 1992 and served as its special correspondent from 1995 to the present. Burrough's other books include *Vendetta: American Express and the Smearing of Edmund Safra*; *Dragonfly: An Epic Adventure of Survival in Outer Space*; *Public Enemies: America's Greatest Crime Wave and the Birth of the FBI, 1933-34*; and *The Big Rich: The Rise and Fall of the Greatest Texas Oil Fortunes*.

He assisted in the search resulting in the nomination of Justice Sonia Sotomayor for the United States Supreme Court. During the Obama administration, Craig took the first step toward fulfilling the campaign pledge to close the detention facility at Guantanamo Bay, and he has been instrumental in revising U.S. interrogation and detention policies.
