Ms. Alabi, OON, SAN is a Senior Partner of Primera Africa Legal (PAL). She leads PAL's Corporate Governance and Compliance Practice. Boma specializes in International Tax Law, Maritime Law, Mergers & Acquisitions and Capital Market Transactions.

Ms. Alabi, OON, SAN served as the President of the Commonwealth Lawyers Association 2011-2013, the first and only woman President in the over 50 year history of this association of lawyers from 54 countries, across 7 Continents. She was a Council Member of the Board of the Royal Commonwealth Society and also served as the Chairwoman of the Association of Women Solicitors of England and Wales between 2005/2006. She is a member of the Institute of Directors and the ICC. She serves on the board of ALFA International, and as Chairman of the Board of Just Commerce Vehicles Ltd. In addition, Boma serves as an INED on a number of other Boards and on the advisory board of WISCAR, a not for profit structured mentoring organization.

Hon. Amy Coney Barrett

Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of the United States Washington, D.C.

A New Orleans native, Justice Barrett received her J.D. from Notre Dame Law School in 1997. She served as a law clerk for Judge Laurence H. Silberman of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit from 1997 to 1998, and for Justice Antonin Scalia of the Supreme Court of the United States during the 1998 Term. After two years in private law practice in Washington, D.C., she became a law professor, joining the faculty of Notre Dame Law School in 2002. She was appointed a Judge of the United States Court of Appeals for the Seventh Circuit in 2017. President Donald J. Trump nominated her as an Associate Justice of the Supreme Court, and she took her seat on October 27, 2020.

Hon. Joseph Donnelly

U.S. Ambassador to the Holy See Rome, Italy

Joe Donnelly was confirmed January 20, 2022, as U.S. Ambassador to the Holy See. Previously, he represented Indiana in the U.S. Senate from 2013 to 2019 and served in the U.S. House of Representatives (2007–13).

Donnelly was born in New York City and raised on Long Island. He attended Notre Dame, receiving a bachelor's degree (1977) in government and a law degree (1981). He worked for a law firm in South Bend before opening a printing business in nearby Mishawaka in 1996. Donnelly was twice reelected to the House before running for the U.S. Senate in 2012. A moderate in a state long divided between largely Democratic urban areas and Republican suburban and rural districts, he won endorsement from newspapers and business organizations throughout the state. Donnelly won the 2012 general election, becoming the first Democrat to win a statewide race in Indiana in more than 10 years.

Bernard Frischer, Ph.D.

Digital Archaeologist, Professor, Department of Informatics, Indiana University Bloomington, Indiana

Dr. Frischer is a leading virtual archaeologist and the author of seven books and dozens of articles on virtual heritage, Classics, and the survival of the Classical world. He is the founding editor of Digital Applications in Archaeology and Cultural Heritage, an innovative online, peer-reviewed journal where scientists can publish interactive 3D models. Dr. Frischer received his B.A. summa cum laude in Classics from Wesleyan University (CT) in 1971 and his Ph.D. summa cum laude in Classics from the University of Heidelberg in 1975. He held a post-doctoral fellowship in Roman archaeology at the American Academy in Rome from 1974 to 1976. Afterwards, he taught Classics and Roman Topography at UCLA from 1976 to 2004. From 2004 to 2013 he was Professor of Art History and Classics at the University of Virginia, where he was also founding Director of the Virtual World Heritage Laboratory. The lab's mission is to apply 3D digital tools to simulating cultural heritage artifacts and sites as heuristic instruments of discovery. Since 2013 he has been a Professor of Informatics in the School of Informatics at Indiana University, where he continues to direct the Virtual World Heritage Laboratory.

Dr. Frischer has been a guest professor at the University of Pennsylvania, the University of Bologna, Beijing Normal University and also held the post of Professor-in-Charge of the Intercollegiate Center for Classical Studies in Rome (2000-01). From 1996 to 2003 he directed the excavations of Horace's Villa sponsored by the American Academy in Rome, and from 1996 to 2004 he was founding director of the UCLA Cultural Virtual Reality Laboratory. The lab was one of the first in the world to use 3D computer modeling to reconstruct cultural heritage sites. Frischer has overseen many significant modeling projects, including Rome Reborn, the virtual recreation of the entire city of ancient Rome within the Aurelian Walls. In recent years, he has focused on digitization and digital restoration of ancient sculpture, creation of a 3D restoration model of Hadrian's Villa, and on using interactive models of historic monuments and the historically restored sky in archaeoastronomical research.

Delia Gallagher

CNN's Vatican Correspondent Rome, Italy

A long-time Vatican analyst for CNN and a leading journalist on religious issues, Gallagher joined the network in 2002 and is based in Rome. Her work at CNN has covered Pope John Paul II, Pope Benedict XVI, and Pope Francis. Drawing from her extensive experience covering the Vatican and religions around the world, Gallagher provides reports and analysis for the network on a wide range of topics involving faith, religion, and values.

In 2021, Gallagher accompanied Pope Francis on his visit to Iraq and has reported extensively on Italy's efforts to combat the coronavirus pandemic. In 2019, she joined Pope Francis' historic trip to the United Arab Emirates -- the first visit to an Arab Gulf state by a pontiff.

She has also reported expansively on sexual abuse in the Catholic Church beginning with the 2002 meeting of US Cardinals at the Vatican under John Paul II through the 2019 sex abuse summit at the Vatican under Pope Francis.

In 2018, Gallagher was the Master of Ceremonies for an event at the Vatican with Pope Francis to launch his new book, *Sharing the Wisdom of Time*, Loyola Press, a collection of wisdom stories from elders, including the Pope and Martin Scorsese. She has also been a featured speaker and moderator at Vatican and international conferences on religious issues for many years.

Gallagher joined CNN after more than five years of covering the Vatican as an analyst for the network and also served as Senior Editor for *Inside the Vatican*.

Gallagher earned a bachelor's degree from the University of San Francisco and holds a master's degree in philosophy and theology from Blackfriars Hall, University of Oxford. Gallagher also worked as a researcher and editor at Oxford University Press. In that capacity, she assisted with a seminal CD-ROM project on the Dead Sea scrolls.

Kati Marton

Author

The Chancellor: The Remarkable Odyssey of Angela Merkel New York, New York

Hungarian born Kati Marton has combined a career as a writer with human rights advocacy. Author of ten books, Marton chaired the International Women's Health Coalition, was Chief Advocate for the UN's Office for Children and Armed Conflict, a trustee of Human Rights Watch, and chair of the Committee to Protect Journalists.

A former ABC News correspondent and Bureau Chief in Germany, Marton started her journalism career at NPR. A bestselling author, Marton is also the winner of several awards for her writing and reporting, including a Peabody Award for a one hour documentary on China. Her books include, Wallenberg, The Polk Conspiracy, Hidden Power: Presidential Marriages That Shaped Our History, The Great Escape – Nine Jews Who Fled Hitler and Changed the World, Enemies of the People - My Family's Journey to America, and True Believer: Stalin's Last American Spy. Her most recent book, The Chancellor – the Remarkable Odyssey of Angela Merkel was a NY Times Notable Book of 2021. The mother of a son and a daughter, Marton lives in New York City.

Angelo Matassa

Data Protection Consultant for GDPR regulation Ret. General of Guardia di Finanza, Financial Crimes Rome, Italy

Mr. Matassa is a retired Brigadier General of the Guardia di Finanza, the Italian Police Force, that deals with the fight against economic and financial crime. He has extensive experience in leading high-risk portfolios involving multiple stakeholders, programs, directorates, and coordinating with domestic, national/international agencies.

After attending the Academy of the Guardia di Finanza, Mr. Matassa graduated in Law at Salerno University and in Economic and Financial Security at Rome "Tor Vergata" University. During his 41 years with the Guardia di Finanza, he oversaw investigations and operations in the areas of Tax and Financial Frauds, Serious and Organized Crime, Money Laundering and Proceeds of Crime, Corruption and Frauds in managing public funds of national and EU budget, Border Security and Customs fraud.

Mr. Matassa served in various professional capacities, across the country, spending almost ten years at the National Headquarters in Rome, covering positions in strategic areas and participating in the decisional process supporting the needs of the Corps.

From 2012 to 2017, he was posted to the Embassy of Italy in Ottawa, as tax police Attaché, to promote and to enhance, on behalf of the Italian Tax Authorities, initiatives for international cooperation with the collateral Canadian counterparts involved in the fight against tax evasion/elusion, any form of economic and financial crime, AML and CTF.

Upon retirement, he began consulting in the public sector for corporate and professionals on the European Union General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR - EU Regulation 2016/679) compliance. He currently is partner in a firm that deals with privacy and compliance to AML and anticorruption legislation.

Lord David Pannick QC

Blackstone Chambers London, England

Lord Pannick QC is one of the UK's most highly regarded advocates, practicing in a broad range of areas with a particular emphasis on Public law, Human Rights and Constitutional Law. He has acted in a large number of the leading public law cases of the last 25 years, appearing in 100 cases in the Appellate Committee of the House of Lords (before it was replaced by the new Supreme Court), more than 20 cases in the Supreme Court since its creation in 2009, more than 25 cases in the European Court of Justice in Luxembourg and over 30 cases in the European Court of Human Rights in Strasbourg. He appears both for Claimants and for Respondents -whether government departments or other public bodies. He acted for Gina Miller in the Supreme Court in September 2019 when the Court held, by 11-0, that the Prime Minister had unlawfully prorogued Parliament and so Parliament was recalled the next day. His recent cases in the Supreme Court include litigation in the fields of employment law, trusts law, patent law and commercial law, as well as public law. He regularly appears in the courts of Hong Kong both for and against the government.

Heather Ann Thompson, Ph.D.

University of Michigan,

Professor of History and African American Studies and author of Pulitzer Prize winner *Blood in the Water: The Attica Prison Uprising of 1971 and Its Legacy* Ann Arbor, Michigan

Dr. Thompson is a historian at the University of Michigan and is a Pulitzer Prize and Bancroft Prize-winning author. *Blood in the Water* received five additional book awards including: the Ridenhour Prize, the J. Willard Hurst Prize, the Public Information Award from the New York Bar Association, the Law and Literature Prize from the New York County Bar Association, the Media for a Just Society Award from the National Council for Crime and Delinquency.

In 2022 *Blood in the Water* remains a top book on many lists including New York Magazine's 14 Best Books on the American Prison System, Book Riot's 8 of the Best Books about the Broken US Criminal Justice System, and the notable, 20 Books that have Changed the way that we Think about Race in America, Business Insider's 23 Best Books Written by Women, and a list that particularly moved her, Books that Inspired the Innocence Project.

Dr. Thompson's audience goes well beyond her work in *Blood in the Water*. She also wrote a seminal study of black politics in urban America in the 1960s and 1970s, *Whose Detroit: Politics, Labor, and Race in a Modern American City*, in 2001 which was re-published in 2017 on the occasion of the 50th anniversary of the Detroit Rebellion of 1967.

Along with Rhonda Y. Williams (Case Western Reserve), she currently edits a manuscript series for UNC Press, Justice, Power, and Politics. She is also the sole editor of the series, American Social Movements of the Twentieth Century published by Routledge.
