Vice Admiral (VADM) Martoglio is an advisor to a wide variety of activities including academic, healthcare, and civic organizations. His focus is on national security, international relations, and strategic leadership.

VADM Martoglio spent about half of his forty-year military career in the US Navy at sea in cruisers, destroyers, and aircraft carriers. While at sea, he commanded an Aegis destroyer, a destroyer squadron, and the RONALD REAGAN Aircraft Carrier Strike Group.

VADM Martoglio spent the other half of his career developing

strategy and leading military operations, initially for the US Navy then for all US military forces. With five tours of duty in Washington, he has also served in senior positions in Asia and Europe. Additionally, he teaches grand strategy and defense policy at UC San Diego's School of Global Policy and Strategy.
