Honorable Stephen Breyer (Ret.)

Lewis F. Powell, Jr. Lecturer

Washington, D.C.

Honorable Stephen Breyer was born in San Francisco, California, and he received an A.B. from Stanford University, a B.A. from Magdalen College, Oxford, and an LL.B. from Harvard Law School. He served as a law clerk to Justice Arthur Goldberg of the Supreme Court of the United States during the 1964 Term, as a Special Assistant to the Assistant U.S. Attorney General for Antitrust, 1965-1967, as an Assistant Special Prosecutor of the Watergate Special Prosecution Force, 1973, as Special Counsel of the U.S. Senate Judiciary Committee, 1974-1975, and as Chief Counsel of the committee, 1979-1980. He was an Assistant Professor, Professor of Law, and Lecturer at Harvard Law School, 1967–1994, a Professor at the Harvard University Kennedy School of Government, 1977-1980, and a Visiting Professor at the College of Law, Sydney, Australia and at the University of Rome. From 1980-1990, he served as a Judge of the United States Court of Appeals for the First Circuit, and as its Chief Judge, 1990-1994. He also served as a member of the Judicial Conference of the United States, 1990-1994, and of the United States Sentencing Commission, 1985-1989. President Clinton nominated him as an Associate Justice of the Supreme Court, and he took his seat August 3, 1994. Justice Breyer retired from the Supreme Court on June 30, 2022.

Chief Justice John T. Broderick, Jr., (Ret.) is the former Executive Director of the Warren B. Rudman Center and former Dean of the University of New Hampshire School of Law. Prior to leaving the bench, he was Chief Justice of the New Hampshire Supreme Court since 2004, and served as

an Associate Justice since 1995. As a trial lawyer at the law firm of Devine, Millimet, Stahl & Branch in Manchester, he chaired the litigation department for several years and served as President of the State Bar Association and the State Trial Lawyer Association, In 1989, he began his own firm of Merrill & Broderick, specializing in civil trial work.

After becoming Chief Justice in 2004, he focused on making justice more accessible, affordable and understandable, and on needed change and innovation in the court system to bring it into the 21st century. He is the recipient of several awards for professionalism and commitment to legal services for the poor. Most recently he received a Lifetime Achievement Award from the New Hampshire Business and Industry Association. He is the only judicial officer in the Association's 97-year history to be so honored. He also received the Bill of Rights Award from the American Civil Liberties Union Chapter in New Hampshire and was recently inducted into the Warren E. Burger Society established by the National Center for State Courts. He is the recipient of four honorary degrees.

Casey Cep

Author and Journalist Eastern Shore, Maryland

Casey Cep is a staff writer at The New Yorker and the author of Furious Hours: Murder, Fraud, and the Last Trial of Harper Lee, which was a New York Times best-seller and named one of the best books of the year by The Washington Post, The Economist, TIME, and President Barack Obama. Cep is a graduate of Harvard College and the University of Oxford, where she studied as a Rhodes Scholar. She lives with her family on the Eastern Shore of Maryland, where she was born and raised.

Nicole Eustace, Ph.D.

2022 Pulitzer Prize Author Professor of History New York University New York, New York

Professor Eustace is an American historian who won the 2022 Pulitzer Prize for History and was a finalist for the 2021 National Book Award for Nonfiction. She graduated from the University of Pennsylvania. Dr. Eustace is a professor of history at New York University, where she has leadership

roles in both the history of women and gender program and the Atlantic history workshop. A historian of the early modern Atlantic and the early United States, she specializes in the history of emotion. She is author of Pulitzer-Prize winning Covered with Night: A Story of Murder and Indigenous Justice in Early America (2021), Passion Is the Gale: Emotion, Power, and the Coming of the American Revolution (2008) and of 1812: War and the Passions of Patriotism (2012) as well as coeditor of Warring for America: Cultural Contests in the Era of 1812 (2017).

Fred D. Gray, FACTL Thurgood Marshall Equality and Justice Award Recipient Civil Rights Activist Tuskegee, Alabama

Fred David Gray is a pioneer of the Civil Rights Movement and a native of Montgomery, Alabama. He is one of the few courageous Black lawyers who risked their lives to attack segregation in the court. He currently lives in Tuskegee, Alabama with his lovely wife, Carol, and continues to practice law specializing in civil rights litigation.

At ninety-one years old, he has pending in the Circuit Court of Macon County, Alabama a case filed by him on behalf of Macon County to declare Macon County owner of the old courthouse site, which was conveyed to the Tuskegee Chapter United Daughters of Confederacy in 1906 for the purposes of converting the property to a white-only park and erecting a monument to the memory of the confederate soldiers from Macon County in honor of their service in the Civil War. Macon County wants to reclaim the property and remove the statue.

He authored *Bus Ride to Justice*, first released in 1995. A Revised Edition released in 2013 was previewed at the Jimmy Carter Center and broadcast on C-Span Book TV. Upon receipt of a copy, President Barack Obama wrote in a letter to Mr. Gray, "Today, we stand on the shoulders of giants who helped move us toward a more perfect Union, and I appreciate your sharing your story." *The Tuskegee Syphilis Study* was released in May 1998. He also wrote *The Sullivan Case: A Direct Product of the Civil Rights Movement*, a review for Case Western Reserve Law Review.

On July 7, 2022, President Joseph Biden awarded Mr. Gray with the Presidential Medal of Freedom, this country's highest award for a civilian. Mr. Gray's life mission has been to "stamp out discrimination," and that is what he continues to do.

The Honourable Justice Mahmud Jamal

Supreme Court of Canada Ottawa, Ontario

Justice Mahmud Jamal was appointed to the Supreme Court of Canada on July 1, 2021. He served as a justice of the Court of Appeal for Ontario from 2019 to 2021.

Before his appointment to the bench, Justice Jamal practised with Osler, Hoskin & Harcourt LLP for over 23 years in the fields of appellate litigation, constitutional and public law, class actions, and commercial litigation. He appeared before the Supreme Court of Canada as counsel to a party or intervener in 35 appeals addressing a wide range of civil, constitutional, criminal, and regulatory issues, including issues of Quebec civil law. He also appeared before the courts of seven provinces, the Federal Court, the Federal Court of Appeal, the Tax Court of Canada, and various federal and provincial administrative tribunals.

Justice Jamal was born in Kenya, raised in England, and completed high school in Edmonton, Alberta. He received a Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Toronto, Bachelor of Laws and Bachelor of Civil Law degrees from the Faculty of Law of McGill University, and a Master of Laws from Yale Law School, which he attended on a Fulbright Scholarship. He served as a law clerk to Justice Melvin L. Rothman of the Quebec Court of Appeal and Justice Charles D. Gonthier of the Supreme Court of Canada.

Jennifer Languell, Ph.D.

President, Trifecta Construction Solutions Civil Engineer and Sustainable Construction Expert Fort Meyers, Florida

Dr. Languell holds a Bachelor's Degree in Materials Science and Engineering, a Master's in Civil Engineering and Construction Management, and a Ph.D. in Civil Engineering and Sustainable Construction.

As president and founder of Trifecta Construction Solutions, Dr. Jennifer Languell has championed the integration of "green" building principles and sustainable design within the construction industry for more than 24 years.

Joseph Margulies, Esq.

Professor of the Practice of Law and Government Cornell University Ithaca, New York

For those who care about titles, I am a Professor of the Practice of Government at Cornell University. I don't really know what that means either. I am trained as a lawyer and have spent the whole of a long career representing the people that others denounce as monsters. Some of my clients have been imprisoned on death row; some have been detained without trial at Guantanamo or tortured at CIA black sites; some have been held at US jails in Iraq. I litigate. I write. I teach. I hope my work makes the world marginally better, though I leave that judgment to others. My career has led me to a deeply personal moral philosophy, which I long ago distilled to eight words: There is no them, there is only us.

The Honourable Robert K. Rae, P.C., C.C., O.Ont., K.C. Ambassador and Permanent Representative to the United Nations in New York Toronto, Ontario

Bob Rae is the Ambassador and Permanent Representative of Canada to the United Nations in New York. He served as Premier of Ontario from 1990-1995, and interim Leader of the Liberal Party of Canada from 2011-2013, and he was elected to federal and provincial parliaments 11 times between 1978 and 2013. He received his Honours B.A. in Modern History from the University of Toronto, an M.Phil in Politics as a Rhodes Scholar at Oxford University and graduated from the University of Toronto Faculty of Law in 1977.

As a lawyer in private practice, Mr. Rae led the restructuring of the Canadian Red Cross, the Toronto Symphony Orchestra, and chaired the board of the Royal Conservatory of Music. He also wrote *Lessons to be Learned* on the Air India bombing, and *Ontario A Leader in Learning* - a study of the Ontario higher education system. He was also named to the Security and Intelligence Review Committee by then Prime Minister Chrétien.

Mr. Rae's return to Parliament for the constituency of Toronto Centre in 2008 led to his appointment as Foreign Affairs spokesman for his party, and to his election as interim Leader in 2011. Between 2013 and 2020 he taught law and public policy at the University of Toronto and was a partner and senior counsel to the law firm OKT LLP, specializing in indigenous law and constitutional issues.

In October 2017, Mr. Rae was appointed as Canada's Special Envoy to Myanmar. In this role, he engaged in diplomatic efforts to address the crisis in the country's Rakhine State and wrote the report "Tell Them We're Human" in 2018. In March 2020, he was named by Prime Minister Trudeau to be Canada's Special Envoy on Humanitarian and Refugee Issues. This led to his report "A Global Pandemic Requires a Global Response," which was made public shortly before his appointment as Ambassador to the UN.

Bob Rae is a Privy Councillor, a Companion of the Order of Canada, a member of the Order of Ontario, and has numerous awards and honorary degrees from institutions in Canada and around the world. In addition to several government reports, he is the author of five books. Along with music, reading, and writing, he loves tennis, golf, and fishing. He is married to Arlene Perly Rae, writer and public advocate on issues affecting women and children. They have three daughters and five grandchildren.

Berit Reiss-Andersen, Esq.

Chair of the Norwegian Nobel Committee Vice Chair of the Nobel Foundation Oslo, Norway

"I was born in Norway, and I have a master of law with honors from the University of Oslo 1981. My first working years I held different positions in public administration, and I was a prosecutor until I became a lawyer in private practice in 1987. I have worked out the Law firm Reiss-Andersen & Co, DLA Piper, and most recently from 2021 in Andenæs Aaløkken Veum. I have predominantly practiced criminal law, including corporate crime, human rights issues, compliance and investigations. I assist companies as well as individual clients. A major part of my working life has been spent in courtrooms. I was appointed Supreme Court Councel in 2002, and I have litigated more than 120 cases in front of the Supreme Court. I have been engaged in the Norwegian Bar Association since I first joined the Oslo Bar as an officer in 1991. Since then, I have held various positions in different committees, inter alia President of the Norwegian Bar from 2008-2012. I was head of the Norwegian delegation to CCBE from 2010- 2018. I am active in Iba and a Vice Chair for the Bar Issues Commission. I have been sitting on various Boards and Committees of humanitarian, commercial and legal nature, in addition cultural activities. Fun fact, I have co-authored two crime novels. I was Vice Minister of Justice in 1997/1998. Since 2012 I have been a member of the Norwegian Nobel Committee and I have chaired the Committee since 2017. I

am also Vice Chair of the Nobel Foundation. I live and work in Oslo, a place that in spite of climate change still has cold winters. I am looking very much forward to speaking to you in sunny Florida!"

Honorable Francis X. Suarez

Mayor, City of Miami Miami, Florida

Francis X. Suarez is the 43rd Mayor of Miami and the first Miami-born mayor. First elected with a mandate of 86 percent and then re-elected with a mandate of nearly 79 percent, Mayor Suarez has championed the integration of climate adaptive policies, Web 3.0 technology, and a free-market approach to government.

Robert P. Trout, FACTL

Schertler Onorato Mead & Sears Washington, D.C.

Since March 1, 2021, Bob Trout has been Of Counsel at Schertler Onorato Mead & Sears in Washington, DC. Before joining his new firm, Mr. Trout practiced for almost 25 years at the litigation boutique he founded, which became known as Trout Cacheris & Solomon. His principal practice has been white-collar criminal defense, defense of agency enforcement actions, Congressional investigations, and complex commercial litigation. He has represented individuals in high-profile whitecollar matters, including Enron, Deepwater Horizon, the Volkswagen emissions scandal, the Mueller Special Counsel investigation, and the Durham Special Counsel investigation. He has defended a number of cases involving charges of public corruption, most notably the criminal case brought against Congressman William Jefferson, during which Mr. Trout and his colleagues successfully challenged the first ever raid on a Congressional office. He also served as Special Counsel to the Council of the District of Columbia in an investigation of potential corruption in government contracts involving a D.C. agency. Most recently, he was lead counsel in the defense of a prominent criminal defense lawyer who was prosecuted—and acquitted—on federal obstruction of justice charges.

Before forming his own firm in 1996, Mr. Trout was a partner at Holland & Knight and before that at Dunnells, Duvall, Bennett & Porter. He began his legal career as a Trial Attorney at the Department of Justice, after which he served for four years as an Assistant U.S. Attorney in Baltimore, Maryland.

Mr. Trout is a former Chair of the Litigation Section of the D.C. Bar and is a graduate of the University of Virginia School of Law.
