

HONORABLE MARK J. BENNETT, FELLOW

Mark Bennett is a Judge of the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit, appointed in 2018.

Judge Bennett graduated summa cum laude from Union College in 1976 and magna cum laude from Cornell Law School in 1979. After law school, Judge Bennett clerked for the Hon. Samuel P. King, Chief Judge of the United States District Court for the District of Hawai'i and then served as an Assistant United States Attorney in the District of Columbia and in Hawai'i for a total of nine years.

Following twelve years as a partner in a Honolulu law firm, Judge Bennett served eight years as Hawai'i's Attorney General. Prior to becoming a judge, Judge Bennett was again a partner in a Honolulu law firm.

As an attorney, Judge Bennett first-chaired more than 100 jury trials and argued more than 50 cases on appeal, including twice successfully before the United States Supreme Court (*Lingle v. Chevron*, 544 U.S. 528 (2005) and *Hawai'i v. Office of Hawaiian Affairs*, 556 U.S. 163 (2009)).

Judge Bennett was inducted as a Fellow of the American College of Trial Lawyers in 2007.

CYNTOIA BROWN-LONG

Cyntoia Brown-Long is an author, consultant, and advocate for criminal justice reform and trafficking victims.

At 16, she was arrested for killing a man who solicited her for sex while she was being trafficked. Tried as an adult, she was sentenced to life in prison without parole for 51 years. Her trafficker was never arrested. While incarcerated, a prison education principal introduced her to a spiritual path, encouraging her to build a positive life despite her circumstances. Her journey included a documentary, a profound encounter with faith, an unexpected romance, and, ultimately, clemency from Tennessee Governor Bill Haslam. Following national and international support from advocates, pastors, and celebrities, she was released on August 7, 2019.

Her memoir, *Free Cyntoia: My Search for Redemption in the American Prison System* (Atria Books), written in prison, chronicles her early struggles, her 15-year incarceration, and her spiritual transformation. It sheds light on the injustices faced by sex-trafficked juveniles tried as adults. Reflecting on her experience, she says, "I was just a teenager when I was sent

to live behind a razor-wire fence. My entire coming of age was within the walls of the Tennessee Prison for Women.”

Determined to drive change, Cyntoia founded JFAM Consulting LLC, providing training and coaching for service providers, judicial bodies, and correctional agencies to promote a dignified approach to criminal justice. Alongside her husband, Jaime, she co-founded The JFAM Foundation to support individuals affected by human trafficking, youth services involvement, and incarceration.

For her advocacy, Cyntoia received the 2022 Leadership Prize from the Juvenile Law Center. In 2020, the Vera Institute of Justice named her a Best of Justice Reform honoree, and she was a nominee for the NAACP Literary Image Award. She has also been featured as a guest columnist for *The Washington Post*.

As a thought leader in legislative and societal reform, Cyntoia speaks at various organizations. Her keynote appearances include Georgetown Law School’s Janet Reno Forum, Broward County Children’s Services, the Ohio Attorney General’s Human Trafficking Summit, and Louisiana’s Anti-Trafficking Initiative hosted by First Lady and Governor Edwards.

Through her work, Cyntoia continues to advocate for justice-involved youth, incarcerated women, and trafficking survivors, using her story to inspire change and reform within the criminal justice system.

ANITA COCHRAN

ACM and CMA nominated country artist, Anita Cochran, was diagnosed with triple positive breast cancer in August of 2017, and she had no idea how tough the road ahead would be. After her first round of chemotherapy sent her into the hospital, her doctor quickly took her off the road for the rest of the year because she would be unable to tour due to the effects of the cancer treatments. Cochran turned to her songwriting as a creative outlet and form of musical therapy. The result is her latest single titled *Fight Like A Girl*, which carries a message of strength and determination in the face of incredible challenge. “*Because I’m a fighter, I’m a survivor, you ain’t gonna change my world*” Cochran sings in the powerful anthem. The words are inspiring not just to those battling cancer, but to men and women alike who are facing their own personal trials.

“My story is about my battle with breast cancer,” Cochran says, “but there are so many people out there who are trying to push past barriers and that’s what this song is about. Everyone is battling something. It’s for all of us. In her blog, titled *Journey to Healing*, she gives candid insight about her treatments and provides support and educational information for people experiencing a similar challenge. Cochran also created a visually stunning video for *Fight Like A Girl* that has already garnered critical acclaim. The video recently won “Best Music Video” at the Creation International Film Festival 2018.

COCHRAN, *Continued*

Cochran grew up on Country, Bluegrass and Gospel music. At the age of 5, she joined as a guitar player/singer and toured every weekend eventually leaving them for a solo career when she reached her dream and signed with Warner Bros. Records in 1994.

HONORABLE LISA M. GINOZA

Lisa M. Ginoza was sworn in as an Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of the State of Hawai'i on January 12, 2024. She previously served on the Intermediate Court of Appeals as Chief Judge (April 2018-January 2024) and as an Associate Judge (May 2010-April 2018).

Justice Ginoza is a graduate of the William S. Richardson School of Law at the University of Hawai'i. She served as a law clerk to the Honorable Samuel P. King, U.S. District Court for the District of Hawai'i. She had an extensive civil litigation practice with the law firm of McCorriston Miller Mukai MacKinnon and also served as First Deputy Attorney General for the State of Hawai'i.

DAVID HOWMAN CNZM

Chair of The Board of Directors at Athletics Integrity Unit (World Athletics)

David is a sport integrity consultant in Wellington. He is the Chair of the Athletics Integrity Board, having been re-appointed to that position by the World Athletics Congress in August 2023, the Chair of World Squash Ethics Commission, Deputy Chair of the International Tennis Federation Ethics Commission, and Chair of the International Cricket Council Anti-Corruption Oversight Group. David was a member of the Australian Government's Panel reporting on Sport Integrity in 2018 and holds the position of Adjunct Professor at AUT. Nationally he is Chair of the Board for Cricket Wellington and was the Reviewer responsible for the report on Gymnastics New Zealand.

David was Director General (more corporately named the CEO) of the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA), from August 2003 until July 2016, and was instrumental in the shaping of WADA into a highly respected and unified global organization responsible for regulating and monitoring world sport and world governments.

Prior to his time at WADA David practised as a barrister specialising in sport law, and represented many prominent NZ players, referees and coaches. He was Chair of Tennis NZ, Fair Play Citing Commissioner for NZ Rugby and SANZAR, and on the Boards of the Hillary Commission and NZ

Sports Foundation. With a large experience of governance at both local and national levels in sport in New Zealand,

accompanying his vast international expertise and management skills, David brings a unique leadership capacity to all matters he is engaged in.

David received a CNZM for services to sport in 2017.

HONORABLE SABRINA SHIZUE MCKENNA

Sabrina McKenna has been an Associate Justice of the Hawai‘i Supreme Court since 2011 and also serves as a justice pro tem on the Supreme Court of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands. She graduated from the University of Hawai‘i at Manoa and its William S. Richardson School of Law (WSRSL) and is currently a member of Duke Law Bolch Judicial Institute’s LLM in Judicial Studies Class of 2025. She was a civil litigator, general counsel to a Japan-based group of companies, and a WSRSL faculty member before serving as a Hawai‘i state trial court judge from 1993 to 2011, presiding over civil, criminal, and family matters. Justice McKenna co-teaches State Constitutional Law at WSRSL and also serves on the Judicial Advisory Board of the George Mason University Antonin Scalia Law School Law & Economics Center’s Judicial Education Program. Her honors include the American Bar Association’s Margaret Brent Women Lawyers of Achievement and Stonewall awards, National Asian Pacific Bar Association’s Daniel K. Inouye Trailblazer Award, University of Hawai‘i’s Distinguished Alumnus Award, and Hawai‘i Women Lawyers’ Outstanding Judicial Achievement Award. She has also been recognized with an Honorary Doctorate from Ryukyu University in Okinawa, as an Eminent Jurist by the Jindal Global Law School (Delhi), and by the Association of Corporate Counsel Foundation (D.C.) as a Global Women in Law & Leadership Honoree.

HONORABLE SUSAN OKI MOLLWAY

Judge Mollway, a Japanese American, is the first Asian American woman to serve as an Article III federal judge. She was nominated to the federal bench in 1998 by President Bill Clinton.

Born and raised in Hawai‘i, Judge Mollway drew inspiration from her father’s service in the segregated Japanese American 442nd Regimental Combat Team, the most decorated unit of its size in US military history. Influenced by her parents’ values, particularly her mother’s love of education, she pursued degrees at the University of Hawai‘i and Harvard Law School. Patsy Mink, the first Asian American woman in Congress, also served as a role model for her.

After 17 years on the federal court bench, Judge Mollway assumed senior status in 2015. She authored *The First Fifteen: How Asian American Women Became Federal Judges*, highlighting the growing influence of Asian American women in shaping American justice. This comes at a time when Asian Americans are the fastest-growing demographic in the US.

HONOURABLE MARY T. MOREAU

The Honourable Mary T. Moreau was born in Edmonton, Alberta. She studied at the Faculté Saint-Jean at the University of Alberta before earning her Bachelor of Laws from the University of Alberta in 1979, participating in the common law/civil law exchange program at the Université de Sherbrooke in 1977. In 2019, she received an honorary Doctorate from the University of Alberta and, in 2023, a Lifetime Achievement Award from Women in Law Leadership.

Called to the Alberta Bar in 1980, Justice Moreau practiced primarily in criminal law, constitutional law, and civil litigation. She litigated landmark cases on minority language rights and the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms and co-founded the Association des juristes d'expression française de l'Alberta.

In 1994, she was appointed to the Court of King's Bench of Alberta, later serving as a deputy judge of the Supreme Court of Yukon (1996) and the Supreme Court of the Northwest Territories (2005). She became Chief Justice of the Court of King's Bench of Alberta in 2017.

Throughout her judicial career, Justice Moreau has been deeply involved in judicial education, ethics, and administration. She lectured at judicial education conferences, co-chaired the National Judicial Institute's National Criminal Law Conference for six years, and participated in international judicial education projects in Mexico, Morocco, Haiti, Ukraine, and Mongolia. From 2014 to 2017, she served on the National Advisory Committee on Judicial Ethics and was president of the Canadian Superior Courts Judges Association from 2011 to 2012.

Justice Moreau chaired the Judicial Advisory Committee for Military Judge Appointments and the Commissioner for Federal Judicial Affairs' Judicial Advisory Committee on International Engagement. As a Canadian Judicial Council member from 2017 to 2023, she served on the Executive Committee, the Judicial Conduct Committee, and chaired the Technology Subcommittee. She was also part of the Action Committee on Modernizing Court Operations, co-chaired by the Minister of Justice and the Chief Justice of Canada.

On November 6, 2023, Justice Moreau was appointed to the Supreme Court of Canada, marking a distinguished career dedicated to legal excellence, judicial education, and justice system modernization.

BAKARI SELLERS

Bakari Sellers was born in 1984 and raised in Denmark, South Carolina. He graduated from the South Carolina public school system and earned his undergraduate degree from Morehouse College in 2005, where he served as student body president. He also earned his law degree from the University of South Carolina in 2008.

Bakari made history in 2006 when, at just 22 years old, he defeated a 26-year incumbent State Representative to become the youngest South Carolina state legislature member and the youngest African American elected official in the nation. In 2014 he was the Democratic Nominee for Lt. Governor in South Carolina. Bakari has worked for United States Congressman James Clyburn and former Atlanta Mayor Shirley Franklin. He served on President Barack Obama's South Carolina steering committee during the 2008 election and is widely considered a rising star within the Democratic Party and a leading voice for his generation. He was named to *TIME Magazine's* 40 Under 40 in 2010, 2014, and 2015 *The Root 100* list of the nation's most influential African-Americans.

Bakari has served as a featured speaker at events for the National Education Association, College Democrats of America National Convention, and the 2008 and 2016 Democratic National Convention. He is the author of the New York Times Bestseller *My Vanishing Country* and a CNN political commentator.

Bakari Sellers is admitted to practice law in all state and federal courts in South Carolina. He is a member of the South Carolina Bar, Richland County Bar Association, and the South Carolina Association for Justice.

Bakari Sellers has been with Strom Law Firm since 2007. He is married to Dr. Ellen Rucker-Sellers. They have three children.

TRACEY S. WILTGEN, M.S., ESQ.

Tracey currently oversees daily operations and programs for The Mediation Center of the Pacific, a not-for-profit corporation that serves over 13,000 individuals annually. She consults with businesses and other agencies such as the Hawai'i State Judiciary, Hawai'i Civil Rights Commission, the Department of Education, and the U.S. Military, to design and develop in-house mediation and dispute resolution programs.

Tracey writes and lectures extensively on mediation and other dispute prevention and resolution processes. She has also designed and conducted trainings and workshops throughout Hawai'i, the Continental U.S., and the Asia Pacific region in basic mediation skills, as well as specialized areas of mediation such as Divorce, Civil Rights, Condominium, Special Education, Family, Elder, Workplace and more, and facilitation and conflict resolution.

Tracey teaches a mediation workshop for the University of Hawai'i, William S. Richardson School of Law. She previously taught at the Matsunaga Institute for Peace and Conflict Resolution, Hawai'i Pacific University, and served as a guest lecturer for Chaminade University.
